## **Sacred Triduum in COOL**

Iturgies, due to COVID-19, we celebrated this year Sacred
Triduum with all the normal rituals during these three holy days. Prior to the Sacred
Triduum, the priests of the Vicariate joined the Chrism Mass at St Joseph's Cathedral in neighbouring Miri. As our Vicariate is still without a bishop after the passing of His Eminence on 29h May 2021, we did not have our own Chrism Mass here in Brunei Darussalam.

The sacred oil that was given to all priests at the Chrism Mass in Miri was formally received into our individual parish on Holy Thursday evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Everyone was happy to see once again the ritual of the Washing of Feet reminding everyone to imitate our Lord's humble action as servant to others. We also had blessing of bread that was baked by our own volunteers the day before to be shared on Good Friday's soup fellowship. We also resumed the practice of giving the congregation the two Eucharistic species on Holy Thursday. We also resume the practice of adoration till midnight of the Blessed Sacrament on this evening after shortening it during the last two years.

As usual, Good Friday is a very busy day for all. Stations of the Cross was done at 12:15 PM. The Good Friday Service starts immediately after the Novena to Divine

Mercy at 3:00 PM. As usual, we use one large wooden cross for the veneration. People are asked to make a simple or profound bow to the cross and not to kiss it as COVID-19 is still very much with us. At the end of the service, a simple soup and bread fellowship was held in the Parish Hall for all. We also did the soup fellowship every Friday of Lent as before.

We are able to have a large fire in the church ground this Easter Vigil before the processing into the church. We have missed doing this part in the last two years. We also restored the full seven readings before the Epistle. Unfortunately, the baptism was still done by pouring the blessed water over the elects instead of getting them immersed into the baptismal font. This year we have 23 elects for baptism and 7 additional adults for confirmation (including 4 from the Anglican church). 4 children was baptised the next day on Easter Sunday

We are all very thankful to God and everyone for participating actively during Holy Week, especially during the Sacred Triduum, enlivening the liturgies and bringing back all the rituals to strengthen our faith. May our new members also greatly stimulate the faith community in the coming years.


## **HEARTS OF HOPE**

This is the cornerstone of our faith, in the Savior who died for our sins.




When criticized by Judas, Jesus defended her saying, "She has done a beautiful thing to me".

Yet for Jesus, the hand of Judas that dips in their shared dish is the same that would embrace him in a treacherous kiss and hand him over to his enemies.


How painful must it have been for the Lord, sold for a mere 30 pieces of silver!

Above all, forgive us our sins that lead you to the cross!





Similarly, He loves us, you and me, in all






What's more, the Lord shows us that Eternal Life is real, He is the Resurrection and He wants us to be with Him.




Alleluia Alleluia!

Let us be like the disciples, obedient to the Lord and be His instruments. even into the fearful unknown situations.


Let Jesus transform our small gifts and abilities into abundant and overflowing blessings.
