Paul does not ask that the Word be merely listened to or studied; he wants it to dwell, that is, to take up stable residence, to shape our thoughts, guide our desires, and make credible the witness of the disciples. The Word of Christ remains a sure criterion that unifies and renders fruitful the life of the Christian community.

### REFLECTION: Be United

In the second reading, St. Paul urged the Corinthians to Overcome divisions within their community: *"I appeal to you... to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice."* Paul reminded them that their identity was not rooted in personalities and preferences, but in Christ alone. When we allow differences to separate us, whether in opinion, character, or style, we forget Jesus, who has called us to be one body, united in love and mission. The Church is strongest when we stay united, centered on Christ rather than on ourselves.

The Gospel echoes this call in a different way, Jesus began his mission by proclaiming, *"Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is close at hand."* Repentance is more than turning away from sin; it is turning our hearts back toward God, realigning our priorities, thoughts, and relationships with His love. When Jesus called the first disciples, they left their nets immediately and followed Him. Unity begins here – when people respond to the same voice, walk behind the same Lord, and allow His call to reshape their lives. Discipleship draws us to communion and mission. Today, let us examine what divides and turn again to Jesus who unites us

How can I work for unity and follow Jesus more wholeheartedly this week?
