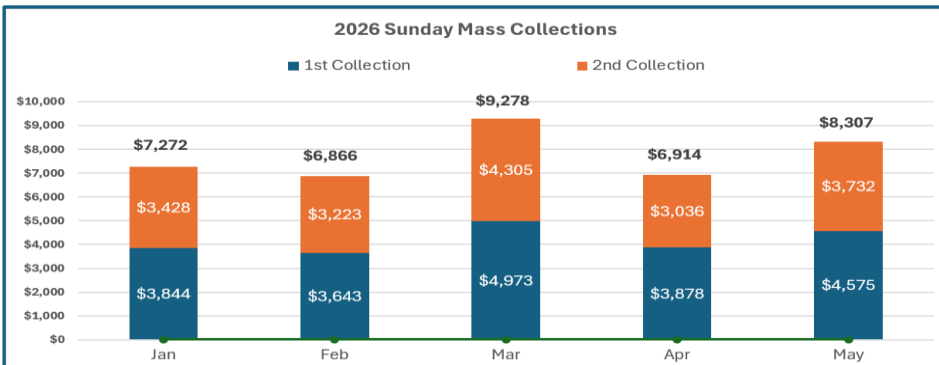
### REFLECTION: A Mission of Compassion

Today's Gospel passage begins with this statement: *"When Jesus saw the crowds, he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd..."* Jesus looks at the crowds, and his response to them is not indifference or annoyance, but deep compassion. He sees them being harassed by circumstances beyond their control, such as sickness, oppression by the Romans and heavy religious burdens. Jesus feels their pain as if it were His own and is thus moved to help them, The heart of Jesus is always towards human weakness. It is a call for us to desire the same heart of Jesus that is moved by people's suffering, rather than remaining indifferent.

Out of compassion, Jesus tells His disciples to pray for more labourers for the mission and immediately sends them out as the answer to His prayer. Today, Jesus sends us out to be the living signs that God's kingdom is near. We may not perform dramatic miracles, but we are called to show God's care and love. Today, may we see people with compassion and go with His strength to be living signs of His presence in the world.

### Reflective question:

Where is God inviting me to reflect His presence, through justice, mercy, generosity, reconciliation, or speaking the truth?
