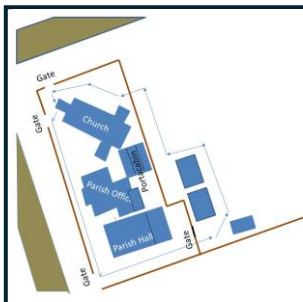

REFLECTION: One Bread, One Body

In the second reading from 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, St. Paul reminds us that the Eucharist is not only personal, but it is also communal: *“The blessing cup that we break is a communion with the blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.”* Each time we receive Communion, we unite ourselves with Christ and with those around us. We cannot receive the Eucharist while dividing ourselves from others. The *“one bread”* calls us to seek unity, to bridge differences, to avoid gossip and division.

In the Gospel, Jesus says, *“I am the living bread... the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.”* Jesus gives Himself totally to us so that we may receive the nourishment necessary to build communion and live as one body, reconciled with God and with one another.

Reflective question:

How can I strengthen unity rather than create division after receiving the Eucharist?

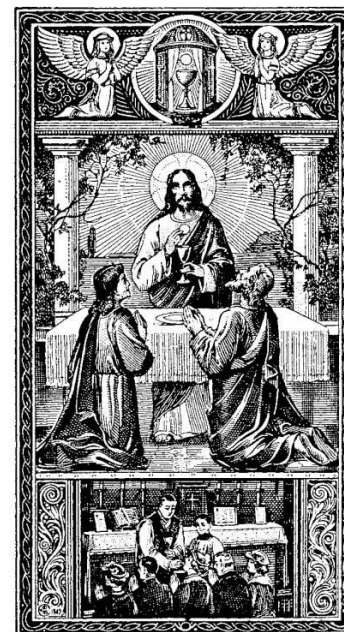

The Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. At the Last Supper, Jesus knew that He was going to leave His friends. So He turned the bread into His Body and the wine into His Blood - even though they still looked like bread and wine - and told the Apostles to do the same.

Jesus gave the Apostles, who were the first priests, the power to change bread and wine into His Body and Blood in the Mass. Now at every Mass Jesus comes to us on the altar, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity!

Of course we can't see any change happen when the priest consecrates the bread and wine, but we know that God can do things without us understanding them. He loves us so much that He wants to come to us hidden in Holy Communion. Now it is up to us to love Him back with our whole hearts!
